Welcome to Renee Denenfeld, our new Audiology Assistant! Renee has joined our team to help improve efficiency and consistency of

care without long waiting periods between appointments with your audiologist. Renee will be helping us with “Clean and Check” appointments. These appointments are scheduled at regular intervals to help keep the hearing aid functioning to its fullest capacity. Simply come in at the appointed time, hand us your hearing aids

and relax. Renee will check the hearing aids for damage or debris, clean them, and return them to you in approximately 20 minutes. Hearing aids are small electronic devices and must be maintained properly to extend their lives. Our Clean and Check appointments allow us to assess wear and tear, perform general cleaning and maintenance in house and help you get the most out of them. Depending on your service agreement with us (i.e. are you within your first two years of a new purchase?), fees for this visit range from \$0.00 - \$40.00 maximum, per hearing aid.

What makes the Clarke Hearing Center different from the competition?

The Clarke Hearing Center is truly patient driven, not product driven. Clarke’s audiologists opt to work with manufacturers who offer reliable, good quality products that meet the diverse needs of our pediatric and adult populations. 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Your Health and Hearing Loss: Are They Related?

Simply, yes! A recent study published in the American Journal of Audiology (2010) found that individuals that suffered from poor cardiovascular health also had increased risk of hearing loss. Your hearing organ is an “end organ,” meaning it is at the end of the blood supply line. If you have cardiovascular disease, your ear is being starved of critical blood flow, ultimately having the potential to affect your capacity to hear. Not only that, but the National Council

on Aging had issued an earlier report that showed that untreated hearing loss can lead to increased stress, isolation and depression – factors that contribute to an increased risk of heart disease. With this information we must change the old age question of the chicken and the egg to: “which came first, the hearing loss or the heart disease?” If you suspect that you or a loved one has hearing loss, it is important to take the appropriate

steps in getting treatment for hearing loss:

1. Talk to your primary care doctor.
2. Get a referral to an audiologist.
3. Have a comprehensive hearing test by a licensed audiologist and bring a loved one with you for a “second set of ears.”
4. Review your results with the audiologist and discuss what treatment options are appropriate for your hearing loss, lifestyle and need.
