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Policies and Procedures for Reopening

Contact Information

- Updated emergency contact completed for each child
 - ✓ Child will not be admitted to school without prior emergency contact in place.
- Families need to identify a consistent person who will drop off and pick up for the children's safety.
- Family cannot deviate from the person whom the child may be released to.

Daily Screening and Drop Off Procedures

- ✓ If your child **has a temperature greater than 100.4F do not send them to school.**
- ✓ If your child has any of the **following symptoms** in the check list below, **do not send them to school.**
- ✓ If anyone in your household has any of the **following symptoms** in the check list below, **do not send your child to school. Symptoms listed that state "when in combination with other symptoms" refers to Covid based symptoms. If your child has one of the single symptoms and not combined with another, they are still expected to stay home, until symptom free for 24 hours, please check with Health & Safety Manager with any questions regarding this.**

- If you, your child, or anyone in your household has been exposed to a positive Covid-19 case, **do not send your child to school.** However, if your child is fully vaccinated and asymptomatic, they may come to school, but you must advise Administration of the exposure. Contact Clarke Administration for further instructions if you are keeping your child at home.
- If a child is exhibiting symptoms upon arrival, the child's temperature will be checked. Staff will make a visual inspection of the child for signs of illness which could include flushed cheeks, rapid breathing or difficulty breathing (without recent physical activity), fatigue, or extreme fussiness.
- If the child has a temperature or exhibits symptoms of concern, the parent will be contacted for pick up and children will be placed in an isolation area with staff member until parent arrives.

- If your family has plans to travel internationally, you **must** inform Clarke Administration of dates of travel and follow CDC (Centers for Disease Control) guidelines for international travel. There are no restrictions or requirements for domestic travel per Pennsylvania regulations, it is recommended to follow domestic travel guidance from the CDC.

Arrival by Vehicle

- No family is allowed into the building, unless pre-scheduled and approved by administration
- Families/guardians are to remain with their vehicle.
- A Clarke staff member will get your child from the vehicle.
- If late, family members dropping off will call the office and a staff member will come down to get the child.

Arrival by Bus

- Driver and Aid are not allowed into the building.
 - ✓ Exception to use bathroom – 1st floor common bathroom.
- Driver and Aid are to remain with their vehicle.
- A Clarke staff member will get students from the vehicle.
- **MASKS** – Effective February 25, 2022, CDC does not require wearing masks on buses or vans operated by public or private school systems, including early care and education/childcare programs. The school district your child comes from could keep the mask requirement in place and families will have to follow. **Families may choose to continue having your child wear a mask while being transported to school.**
- If late, the driver will call the office and a staff member will come down to get the child.
- **No one is to enter the building.**
- **If a child does not need transportation to school, parent/guardian will inform transportation that their child does not need to be picked up.**

Pick Up by Vehicle

- Dismissal is at 1:30 daily
- Parent/ Guardian wait at their vehicle until the child is brought to your vehicle by a Clarke staff member.
- If a child needs to be dismissed early, parent/guardian will remain at their vehicle and call the office. The child will be escorted to the vehicle.

Pick Up by Bus

- Dismissal is at 1:30 daily
- Driver and Aid to wait with their bus until the students are brought to the bus by a Clarke staff member.
- **No one is to enter the building.**
- **If a child needs to be dismissed early, parent/guardian will inform transportation that their child does not need to be picked up.**

Food – Snacks/Lunch

- Pack a snack and lunch for your child daily
 - ✓ Lunch bags are permitted, please clearly label child's belongings

Personal Items

- No outside, blankets/toys/personal items
 - ✓ Except extra clothes required for cubbies

Toys/Materials

- Children will have individual bins with their names on them for items used daily such as crayons, markers, glue sticks, etc.
- Classroom materials being used will be disinfected each day with an electrostatic unit.

Visitors

- Parents, outside therapists, and site visitors will be permitted with administration approval. Masks are not required to be worn by visitors; it is their choice to wear one when inside the building. All visitors to Clarke are required to follow health and safety guidelines that are in place.

Cleaning/Disinfecting

- Thorough disinfection of all surfaces and toys will occur daily.
- At the end of each day toys will be disinfected.
- Classroom spaces, offices, and materials will be disinfected each day with an electrostatic unit.
- In the event of a positive exposure, a deep clean of the facility will be completed before staff and students return on site.

Mitigation Procedures

- Per Pennsylvania Department of Education guidelines and the CDC, students will maintain at least 3 feet of physical distance in the classroom
- Effective March 9, 2022, Clarke will follow the Philadelphia Board of Health guidance and masks will no longer be required by students or staff no matter the vaccination status. There will be a 1-week mask requirement after spring break to avoid a post break surge in cases per PBOH. Families may choose to have their child continue to wear a mask while in school and must advise Administration of their request in writing that they want their child to continue masking while in the building. Staff may choose to continue masking at any time. People with symptoms, a positive test, or exposure to someone with COVID-19 will be required to wear a mask when in the building during the additional 5 days of quarantine when cleared to return to the building. Masks are also not required to be worn outside.
- Staff and students will complete handwashing routines regularly, in-between activities, before and after mealtime, before and after outdoor play, etc.

Child Illness while at School

Families should follow this chart only if their child is positive for Covid-19 and you follow the guidance for scenarios #1, #2, and #3. The full chart is to be followed by staff, or by families who students are old enough and are vaccinated.
- Masks are required to be worn when returning to work or school during the last 5 days of quarantine per scenarios listed in the update above.
